## Vision:

A self-sustaining organization, with excellent service delivery for socio-economic development of the community.

## Mission:

To provide practical quality demand – driven products and services to the community.



## HISTORY

Give a Goat – Africa is a registered non-governmental organization (reg. no. 5. 5914/7046) with the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Uganda since 13/04/2007. The organization projects were initiated in close collaboration with support of SchekeeineZiegeVe-Germany (in English- Give a goat Germany). The organization owns 22.6 hectors of land and it's located at Rwesororo hill, Kagando parish, Kisinga Sub County in the district of Kasese.

The organization provides agriculture, education, socio-economic and environmentally related projects in the Sub counties of Kisinga, Kyondo, Kyarumba and Munkunyu for community development. The organization has founder board, board of directors, administrative staff, workers and supportive staff.

## PROGRAMS

**Health:** Under this program, the organization has an established health centre and provides health insurance and treatment of different diseases. It also sensitizes the community to prevent both communicable and non-communicable diseases.

**Education:** The organization promotes primary school education to enable pupils in rural areas perform better in the Primary Leaving Examination and join good secondary schools. It established a primary school with over 100 pupils where quality education is maintained.

**A**griculture (Livestock and poultry): The organization empowers the community members to establish income generating projects through livestock and poultry keeping. It has established a center for breeding high breed goats, piglets and poultry which are given to community members at a subsidized cost rear them and sell when they grow to generate income.

**E**nvironmental conservation through promotion of new innovations/technology: The organization is promoting new innovations and technology to conserve the environment. It has installed a solar system to demonstrate ways of generating solar energy for lighting and cooking.

## CHALLENGES

Inadequate staff motivation and insufficient staffing

Inadequate and inappropriate infrastructure (roads)

Inadequate tools and equipment

Lack of effective communication means

Improper unreliable power and inadequate water

Improper organization management.

## OUTCOMES

**O**ver 500 people have been registered for health insurance and the community has accessed treatment of diseases like malaria.

**A** primary school with 2 classes (primary 6 and 7) has been established with over 100 pupils. In the 2013 Primary Leaving Examination results, 8 pupils passed in first grade and 25 in the second grade and these joined good secondary schools.

**O**ver 270 households have accessed high breed goats, piglets and poultry.

**A** solar system of 90 panels to be used for pumping water for irrigation and lighting has been installed at the centre. Over 10 solar systems are in the process of being installed to provide the community with energy sources for both cooking and lighting.
