HISTORY

LADA is a grassroots indigenous non-governmental organization rooted on the philosophy "Building Strong Children, families and communities" its strategic focus is on water and sanitation, livelihood enhancement through enterprise development, value addition, credit and savings, child survival and development, clean energy, watershed/catchment conservation, HIV and AIDS, and Human right and advocacy.

PROGRAMS

Water and Sanitation program: With support from Gorta LADA promotes access to clean and safe water chain through protection of open water sources and shallow wells, catchments protection and conservation, and community civic education on hygiene and sanitation.

CHALLENGES

Limited staff capacity in resource mobilization more especially in grant writing and mobilization for in-kind contributions

Staff cohesion and supervision has gaps

Limited skills on how to build partnerships and coalitions

Limited skills on how to conduct an effective community needs assessment and engaging communities in development

ACHIEVEMENTS

25 open water sources have been protected, 16 springs and 9 shallow wells. This has promoted clean and safe water chain.

37,500 individuals have benefited through awareness creation for both environmental and human health to ensure clean and safe water supply.

A total of 25 water user committees have been formed to ensure sustainability of safe water chain at the grassroots.

The program has directly enrolled 75 households, and 60 children in secondary school and primary schools reaching to 480 individuals.

Under this program LADA services have reached to more than 75,000 people including children, people living with HIV & AIDS and their families.
